Dear Nursing Applicant:

Thank you for your interest in Minnesota State Community and Technical College's Nursing programs. The attached documents will provide you with the information you will need to apply to the Generic Nursing Degree RN offered in a rotating schedule at our Detroit Lakes, Fergus Falls, and Wadena campuses. NOTE: the Associate Degree Nursing Generic RN program is not offered at the Moorhead campus. The Minnesota State Community and Technical College nursing programs are designed to prepare qualified students for a career in nursing. Please note: PSEO students are not eligible to take nursing courses.

Students who complete the application process and have graduated from high school or earned a GED certificate will be accepted into the college for general education courses. **However, acceptance into the nursing program is based on selective admission criteria.** Please review the enclosed information carefully.

### Minnesota State Community and Technical College Nursing Program Application Procedure

**Step One: Circle the procedure you will follow to start the process of applying to MSCTC's Nursing Program (Please note - you do not need to have your pre-requisites completed prior to applying to the nursing program - but, you will have to complete you pre-requisites prior to starting nursing courses if you are accepted to the program):**

**NEW STUDENT TO MSCTC** – you should follow this procedure if you are a student who has never attended Minnesota State Community and Technical College in Detroit Lakes, Fergus Falls, Wadena, Moorhead or Distance Education.

**RETURNING STUDENT TO MSCTC**- you should follow this procedure if you have attended MSCTC in the past, but you are not currently enrolled in courses. If you have ever attended any one of the campus locations or distance education, consider yourself a returning student.

**CURRENT MSCTC STUDENT** – you should follow this procedure if you are currently attending an MSCTC campus or taking online courses.

#### **NEW STUDENT TO MSCTC**

a. For general education classes- if you are not a current MSCTC student and have not been an MSCTC student in the past

- Submit an online application for admission at [www.minnesota.edu/admissions](http://www.minnesota.edu/admissions)
- Submit a \$20 application fee
- Submit high school or GED and college transcripts.

*You can be accepted to MSCTC at any time - you must be accepted to the college prior to being considered for the nursing program.*

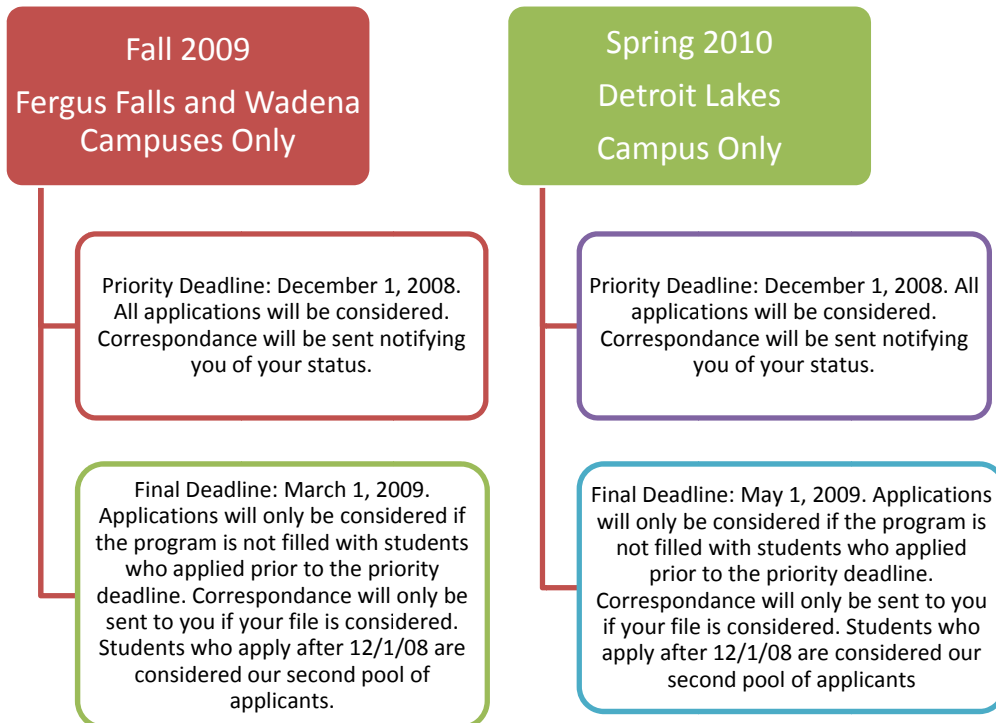
**RETURNING STUDENT TO MSCTC**

### APPLYING TO THE ASSOCIATE DEGREE GENERIC RN NURSING PROGRAM

Complete the following checklist to apply.

- Complete the Program application.
- Become accepted to MSCTC with all previous high school or GED and college transcripts.
- Verify you meet the GPA requirements for the program on the enclosed Pre-requisite document. Applicants will not be considered if they do not meet the minimum GPA criteria.
- Complete the Accuplacer assessment and be eligible to take college level English and Math 1020. If you take the Accuplacer assessment and place into developmental coursework, the coursework must be completed prior to starting core nursing courses, if you are accepted.
- Earn a "C" or better grade in all developmental, general education, and nursing courses in order to be considered for the program. The nursing application should be sent to:

**Your application must be received by MSCTC by 5pm on the deadline date.**

### Step Three: Notification of Candidates

Priority students will receive a letter from the college after the selection of candidates is complete. All students will be notified. Your letter will indicate that you are accepted to the program, placed on the waiting list for the program, or denied admittance to the program. **All information in this packet is subject to change based on availability.**

## 2009-2010 Nursing Pre-Requisites

Programs	Generic RN Program
Locations	Detroit Lakes, Fergus Falls, Wadena
Acceptance to MSCTC	All students who apply to the Generic RN Nursing program must have completed the application process and be accepted to the college no later than 2 weeks after the deadline.
GPA Requirement – Student who has earned 12 or more college credits - not to include developmental coursework	If you are a college student who has earned 12 or more general education college credits required for the practical nursing program your G.P.A. must be at least 2.50 in Human Anatomy I, Human Anatomy II, College Writing I and Developmental Psychology to apply.
GPA Requirements – student who has not earned 12 or more college credits	If you are a high school student or a student who has not earned at least 12 credits toward the associate degree nursing program, your high school G.P.A. must be at least a 3.00 at the end of your junior year to apply AND you must have taken one year of high school Chemistry and/or Biology. If you have not taken Chemistry and/or Biology in high school but have earned a 24 or greater on the science portion of the ACT test and have at least a 3.00 G.P.A. at the end of your junior year – you are also eligible to apply to the program. <b><i>If you do not meet these criteria, please contact a counselor at the campus you wish to attend for your options.</i></b>
GPA Requirement – Students who have earned a GED	If you have a GED, you will need to reflect a score of 500 or greater. If you are unable to obtain a score report for your GED, you may still apply. Your eligibility will be based on availability in the program.

<b>Assessment Testing</b>	Students who have not completed College English and College Algebra and who do not have a recent ACT score are required to complete assessment testing <b>prior to applying for the nursing program</b> . Check online at <a href="http://www.minnesota.edu">www.minnesota.edu</a> for assessment testing dates and locations.
<b>Development Coursework</b> DVCM 0006 Comp Building ENGL 0055 Reading ENGL 0050 Writing Fund MATH 0052 Found of Math MATH 0090 Intro Algebra	All Developmental coursework, if required by the Assessment test results or ACT scores must be completed prior to starting core nursing courses. Students must earn a "C" or better in all developmental coursework to be eligible for acceptance to the program.
<b>Math Requirement</b>	Students must be eligible to take Math 1020 Intermediate Algebra or higher or have taken a college level math course (this does not include developmental coursework). If a student tests into developmental Math 0052 or Math 0090, all courses must be completed prior to starting core nursing courses.
<b>English Requirement</b>	Students must be eligible to take English 1101 OR completed Developmental English 0050 prior to starting nursing courses.
<b>Pre-requisite Courses – These are the courses that are required prior to starting core nursing courses.</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. CSCI 1100 Computer Essentials or successful test out of the course.</li> <li>2. Certified Nursing Assistant Course within the last 5 years or currently on the registry. If student has taken the course more than 5 years prior and is currently employed as a CNA, they have also met this pre-requisite.</li> </ol>
<b>Selection of Candidates for MSCTC Nursing Programs</b>	<p><u>Students who have earned 12 college credits which count as general education requirements for the nursing program:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> If you have completed 12 or more college level credits (not to include developmental courses) you will be awarded points for your grades in the following courses: Developmental Psychology, College Composition, and Anatomy and Physiology I and II.</li> </ul> <p>If you are a student who has not completed Anatomy and Physiology I or II but you have completed one of the following courses – your grades in those courses will be used in place of Anatomy and Physiology for selection:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ BIOL 2257 Medical Microbiology w/lab</li> <li>➤ CHEM 1100 Fundamental Concepts of Chemistry w/lab</li> <li>➤ BIOL 2202 Principles of Nutrition</li> </ul> <p><u>Students who have not earned 12 college credits which count as general education requirements for the nursing program:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><input type="checkbox"/> If you are a student who has not completed 12 or more college level credits, you will be given points for your cumulative GPA at the end of your junior year in high school (if you are currently attending high school) or your final GPA upon graduation (if you have already graduated from high school).</li> </ul>
<b>Other Requirements</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. All nursing programs require students to have a laptop computer for nursing coursework. The cost for a laptop computer will be in addition to the cost of tuition, fees, and books.</li> <li>2. The clinical facilities which are utilized by the Generic Nursing RN program require students to have a current American Heart Association/Health care providers CPR certificate. Proof of CPR certificate must be presented prior to starting core nursing courses.</li> <li>3. Students who are accepted to the Generic Nursing RN program are required to complete and pass a background study four weeks prior to starting nursing courses. Students who do not successfully complete or refuse to complete a background study will be ineligible to start core nursing courses.</li> </ol>

4. Students who are accepted are required to complete a health form. Students who do not complete the health form will be ineligible to start core nursing courses.
