Explain the goals and desirable clinical outcomes for nonsurgical periodontal therapy. 9. Select the correct method for extrinsic stain removal. 10. Plan dental hygiene care for patients who have special needs. 11. Formulate a dental hygiene diagnosis based on assessment findings. 12. Develop dental hygiene care plans for a patient with plaque-induced gingivitis, Stage I or II periodontitis, and Stage III or IV periodontitis.
