Evaluate the thinking and views of various types of terrorists and terrorist organizations in history. Discuss incidents of terrorism occurring within U.S. borders. Identify significant domestic terrorist groups and ideologies. Discuss how the threat of terrorism has impacted the personal freedoms of Americans.
