Describe the proper techniques and terminology for extraoral and intraoral examination.</li><li>8. Describe the dental examination including periodontal and dental structures.</li><li>9. Describe oral disease development and contributing factors.</li><li>10. Describe biofilm, soft deposits, calculus, and dental stain development and composition.</li></ol>
