

ECHO2200 - Adult Echocardiography Clinical I

Description:	This course provides a supervised clinical practicum that prepares students to develop cognitive, psychomotor and affective learning domains for adult transthoracic echocardiography. Students demonstrate increasing proficiency in the required echocardiography imaging modalities that allow them to achieve clinical competency.
