

ELL1085 - English Language Learner Writing II

Credits:	3 (3/0/0)
Description:	This writing course is for multi-lingual learners of English and is designed to prepare students for college-level writing tasks and courses. Students will practice the writing process while creating multiple-paragraph essay forms with an emphasis on paraphrasing, summarizing, quoting and analyzing sources. Students will inventory patterns of error and create an individual plan for increasing accuracy.
