Description:	Meets MnTC Goal Area 1. This course builds on the foundations of College Writing and provides students with additional opportunities to develop fluency in their writing through a process approach. Students read critically from a variety of literary genres, explore meaning through academic research and responding through discussion and writing. Coursework includes an introduction to argumentative writing and writing from academic sources.
