

## ENGL2323 - Horror and Supernatural Fiction

Description:	This course meets MnTC Goal Areas 2 and 6. This course is an in-depth study of literary texts that fall under the category of horror and/or supernatural fiction. While the focus is on this genre, the course may also address sub-categories of detective fiction, science fiction and fantasy.

Lovecraft.</li> <li>Relate horror and supernatural fiction to their historical contexts.</li> <li>Explain how horror and supernatural fiction is critically received and its contribution to the literary world.</li> <li>Differentiate between contemporary and historical reactions to the literature.</li> <li>Interpret the literature within the framework of contemporary theoretical or historical contexts.</li> <li>Construct and write analytical compositions about the readings.</li> <li>Participate in small and large group literary discussions.</li> </ol>
