

ENGL2325 - Contemporary World Literature

Description:	Meets MnTC Goal Areas 6 and 8. This course provides students an opportunity to read, discuss and analyze contemporary literature from around the world. The focus of the course is on fiction, although students may also be introduced to other contemporary world literature such as poetry, non-fiction and drama.

Compare and contrast the course readings for their cultural, social, religious and/or linguistic differences. Explain how the literature can educate people about their responsibilities as world citizens. Explain how the literature expresses human values within a historical and social context. Demonstrate awareness of the scope and variety of contemporary world literature.
