

HIST1302 - World History: 1500s to Present

Description:	Meets MnTC Goal Areas 5 and 8. This course provides a discussion of the political, economic, cultural and social factors that have shaped global history of the past five centuries, from the emergence of global commerce to the post-Cold War world. Topics include the rise of industrial capitalism, colonialism and imperialism, social and political revolutions, decolonization, and major upheavals of the late 20th and early 21st centuries.
