Utilize various coding references for ICD-10-PCS (International Classification of Diseases - 10th Revision - Procedure Coding System), CPT (Current Procedural Terminology) and HCPCS (Healthcare Common Procedure Coding System).</li><li>7. Describe information systems utilized in the assignment of procedure codes.</li><li>8. Comply with ethical standards of practice.</li><li>9. Evaluate the accuracy of procedure coding using sample exercises and medical records.</li></ol>
