Description:	Meets MnTC Goal Areas 2 and 6. This course offers continued study and application of concepts from MUSC 1121 and 1122, including functional harmony, basic style and form analysis, chromatic harmony and an introduction to 20th century harmonic practices. Course includes comparisons of music from various stylistic periods and beginning studies in counterpoint.

Demonstrate awareness of the scope and variety of musical works of the Common Practice era. Respond critically to music of the Common Practice era. Engage in the compositions of short pieces of music. Articulate an informed personal reaction to music study aurally and visually. Demonstrate an awareness of keyboard skills as related to music theory study.
