

NURS2410 - Role Transition

Description:	This course prepares the practical nurse to transition into the professional nursing role. Concepts of legal and ethical considerations in practice, holistic assessment, the nursing process and development of individualized plans of care will be explored while integrating informatics, evidence-based practice, patient-centered care, safety and quality improvement.

Differentiate components of the holistic assessment from the role of the practical nurse to the professional nurse. Illustrate a holistic plan of care that utilizes the nursing process while integrating concepts of quality, safety and evidenced-based practice. Examine the multiple dimensions of patient-centered care with regard to teaching and learning principles for diverse populations. Utilize informatics to communicate, manage knowledge, mitigate error and support decision making.
