

# PDEV2701 - Applied Coop Experience I

Credits:	3 - 12
Description:	The course is designed to allow for career-related activities encountered in the student's area of specialization offered through a cooperative experience between the College, employer and student. Under supervision of the employer, the student combines classroom learning with work experience(s) directly related to an academic/technical discipline. Specific learning objectives guide the student through the work experience.

Comply with all organizational, industry-specific, institutional and instructional guidelines as presented (Cooperative Experience and Application and Weekly Work Reports).</li> <li>6. Attend a minimum of 22 cooperative contact hours/week (two lectures, 20 coop) = 3 credit hours.</li> </ol>
