Categorize the major classifications of medications, common medications within each classification, potential and actual complications, contraindications and rationales for medication administration for mental health problems. Apply knowledge of pharmacology, pathophysiology and nutrition to the care of patients with mental health disorders. Provide rationale to support nursing judgments and prioritization of care for individual patients experiencing mental health disorders.
