Description:	This course will provide students with the knowledge and resources to enter practice as a Mental Health Behavioral Aide II. Identify and understand the purpose of treatment interventions in children with mental illnesses.</li> <li>3. Describe basic data practices and privacy issues as they relate to children with mental illnesses.</li> <li>4. Review therapeutic communication techniques for children with mental illnesses.</li> <li>5. Identify personal biases related to children and families with mental illnesses.</li> <li>6. Demonstrate increased self-awareness in working with children with mental illnesses.</li> <li>7. Demonstrate knowledge of suicidal ideation and prevention in children with mental illnesses.</li> <li>8. Demonstrate an understanding of the aide's impact in working with a child in his or her home.</li> <li>9. Demonstrate knowledge of skill-building in peer-to-peer and parent-child interactions.</li> <li>10. Review techniques for performing as a practice partner or role-play partner.</li> <li>11. Review strategies for redirecting and de-escalating at-risk behavior.</li> <li>12. Identify and define causes of behavior.</li> </ol>
