

SPAN1101 - Beginning Spanish I

Description:	Meets MnTC Goal Area 8. This course is the first semester of Beginning Spanish. Students will develop reading, writing, listening and speaking skills through a focus on historical, political, cultural and artistic expressions of the Spanish-speaking world. This course provides basic instruction in the correct form and use of the Spanish language. Study concentrates on oral and written comprehension of simple Spanish, verbal expression of personal themes, pronunciation and grammar.

Describe the influence of diverse cultures on the historical and contemporary Spanish-speaking world. 15. Compare the experience and contributions of Hispanics in society and culture. 16. Identify the distinct cultural, social, religious and linguistic differences among Spanish speakers.
