

COSMETOLOGY DIPLOMA - 58 CREDITS

About this program

Cosmetology is the art, science and business of beauty care and offers students a variety of career opportunities. Students completing the Cosmetology program can choose to be general cosmetologists or to excel in an area of expertise such as perming and cutting, hair care and coloring, or skin and nail care. Students receive a combination of classroom and laboratory work with the opportunity to practice their skills on mannequins and actual customers in the campus salon. Acquired cosmetology hours or credits earned and documented from other licensed colleges, whether in or out of state, may be accepted upon approval of the Minnesota Board of Cosmetologists. Graduates holding a valid cosmetology license are eligible for employment in salons and many other unique employment settings. The Board of Cosmetologists, which is the cosmetology licensing body, requires 1,550 hours of clinical time in order to become licensed in Minnesota. Upon completion of 1,550 hours and passing of the state exam, a license will be issued. (Note: 33 credits in Salon Practicum is the maximum number of credits which can be applied toward the diploma.)

Program outcomes

- 1. Relate knowledge and technical procedures to perform proficiently in all cosmetology skills.
- 2. Apply ethical behaviors and human relation skills with patrons, employers and co-workers.
- 3. Show professionalism in all relationships in the cosmetology salon environment.
- 4. Know and understand the Minnesota state laws, rules and regulations that pertain to the individual policies or responsibilities of all cosmetology license holders.
- 5. Know employee sanitation procedures and perform safety procedures in compliance with Minnesota laws and rules.
- 6. Evaluate hair, skin and nail disorders or diseases that should be referred to a physician.
- 7. Prepare and know the specific uses and safety of all equipment and supplies used in the cosmetology salon.
- 8. Prepare the chemical formulas necessary to ensure accurate product knowledge to perform cosmetology services.

Course summaries

This course is intended for manicurists, estheticians and some transfer students. In a condensed form, this course will include the topics of chemistry, electricity, salon business, professional image, anatomy and infection control. Prereauisites: none COSM1002 - Client Consultations (1 credits) This course is for cosmetology and esthiology students. Students will develop the skills necessary for a successful client consultation to achieve the COSM1003 - License Preparation Cosmetology (1 credits) This course will prepare the cosmetology student for the general theory exam, written practical exam and Minnesota laws and rules exam issued by the Minnesota State Board of Cosmetology. Additionally, the student will practice mock tests in preparation for skills certification. Cosmetology students will review their knowledge and skills in all theory and practical topics learned throughout their training. Completion of this course will help the student identify areas of weakness that need additional review prior to scheduling their state exams and completing cosmetology skills certification. This course covers the composition of product ingredients, changes produced by cosmetic products, color theory, makeup applications, eyelash and evebrow tinting, air brush makeup, camouflage makeup and facial structure. reformation treatments that permanently straighten highly textured hair or soften curl, and semipermanent hair reformation treatments that eliminate frizz and smooth curly or wavy hair temporarily. In this course, students learn various types of sodium hydroxide and thio relaxers, allowing them to provide a wide range of hair reformation services on different hair textures. This course covers advanced spa services, body treatments and alternative related therapies. Students will be able to identify, explain and determine spa treatments and services suited for individual clients needs. COSM1007 - Gel Nail Applications (1 credits) This course provides an introduction to gel applications for cosmetology and nail technology students. Students will understand the procedures for tips with overlays, natural nails and sculpted nails using various types of gel enhancement products. COSM1010 - Eyelash Extensions (1 credits) This course is for cosmetology students, esthiology students and anyone who wishes to perform eyelash extensions. "Eyelash extensions" means the application, removal and trimming of threadlike natural or synthetic fibers to an eyelash, and includes the cleansing of the eye area and lashes. Eyelash extensions do not include color agents, straightening agents, permanent wave solutions, bleaching agents, applications to the eyebrow or any other cosmetology service. COSM1100 - Salon Safety(1 credits) This course is for students pursuing a cosmetology, esthiology, nail technology and eyelash technology career. Students will learn the necessary precautions and safety measures to ensure a safe working environment. Students must pass all applicable sections of the Infection Control Practical Skills test prior to providing services on live models during preclinical training and prior to providing services on the client clinic floor. This course is for cosmetology and esthiology students. Students will learn how to perform a skin analysis and determine skin types. Client skin analysis is an important part of an esthetician's or cosmetologist's skills, since recommending the appropriate skin care products and regime must be individualized for each person. COSM1117 - Shampooing and Rinsing (1 credits) This course covers shampooing and draping. Students will learn the importance of selecting the correct shampoo for various hair types. This course will help students develop a strong foundation in haircutting. Students will learn basic sectioning and cutting techniques, along with correct use of scissors, razors and clippers to achieve a strong foundation in haircutting. This course will instruct students in conducting services in a safe environment. Students will learn the styling and finishing techniques to complete a hairstyle to the satisfaction of the client.
