

AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE STUDIES CERTIFICATE - 18 CREDITS

About this program

The American Sign Language (ASL) Studies certificate provides students with a basic knowledge of American Sign Language and Deaf Culture. The curriculum provides a foundation for entry into a career in a deafness-related field and prepares students for continued educational studies in more advanced preparation for ASL interpreter certification. This program does not prepare students to become interpreters.

Program outcomes

- 1. Demonstrate basic conversational skills and use of appropriate American Sign Language vocabulary, finger spelling and numbers.
- 2. Effectively communicate with deaf and hard-of-hearing people in a variety of settings.
- 3. Be prepared to meet the ASL prerequisites for sign language interpreter education programs.
- 4. Comprehend that the Deaf community shares a set of values, rules and traditions different from typical American values.
