Applicants for the Dental Assisting program will be assigned points for the courses listed below to determine which applicants will be accepted. The 30 applicants who have the most points will be selected for admission into the Dental Assisting program. To receive points for the courses, applicants must have completed the courses and received a letter grade before May 15. We will average all grades (A-F) for each course. All science courses must be completed within the last five (5) years to be eligible for points.

You may apply before all of the prerequisite courses are completed but should be registered for them during spring semester. You must maintain a 2.5 or better grade point average.
